The General Contractor has been hired and will be seeking individuals to form a 'base crew' for this Indigenous 18-24 month net-zero construction project. Many additional employment, 'upskilling' and learning opportunities will be filled through sub-contractors. In addition, the 'base crew' may gain experience with the General Contractor on a large building project currently underway in Kingston.

FNTI is an equal opportunity employer, committed to the advancement of women in the trades. We provide a respectful workplace and encourage women who have a desire to further their skills development in the trades to submit a resume. All serious applicants will be included in our labour pool.
